Woodstown will distribute Recycle containers in late May. Recycle Bank is looking into how to involve other municipalities in the program. We should ask the Salem County Utilities Authority to discuss recycling at the June meeting.
Hope Community Church and Auburn Estates are coming back to the County Planning Board with plans.
